Sioux City Camera Club Hosts

Golden Anniversary N4C Convention

SIOUX CITY, IA – In the spring of 1955 a group of camera enthusiasts met on the front porch of Francis Kingsbury's home in Ponca, Nebraska and planned their vision to promote photography throughout the Midwest.

That vision was put into place with the birth of the North Central Camera Club Council, N4C beginning in 1956.

On September 15, 50 years after its formation, the N4C which now includes over 40 clubs from a 10 state Midwest area will assemble in its birthplace for its Golden Anniversary Convention.

The 50th N4C Convention is planned for Sioux City on September 15, 16, and 17th at the Marina Inn in So. Sioux City, Nebraska.

"An exciting program of field trips and great speakers is planned," said former Sioux City Camera Club president and founding father of the N4C, Fran Kingsbury.

The Friday, September 15, first stop on the day's field trips will stop at the Milwaukee Railroad Roundhouse and Rail Museum. The complex consists of a roundhouse, working turntable, sand tower, and several support buildings.

There are also vintage rail cars and a steam locomotive (Great Northern 1355) on display. This museum offers a glimpse into the golden age of steam locomotives when Sioux City was the 10th largest rail center in the United States.

The second stop is the Woodbury County Courthouse. This is the largest example of Prairie Style architecture on the planet. William Steele designed it. The building is a National Landmark.

This 1500-acre State Park has 10 miles of trails and is located on the Missouri River. Our tour will concentrate on the historic buildings such as Lamont Country Schoolhouse, a Lutheran Church and Shay-Adams home and more.

Saturday's seminars should spark a creative ember in all attendees according to Sioux City Camera President Jack Bristow when Jeff Morgan of Elm Studios from Minneapolis, MN. speaks about making better pictures, panoramics, and digital infrared photography.
